Missing Bean, 1 Newtec Place, 66-72 Magdalen Road, Oxford, OX4 1RE [Sourdough]

Established in 2009, Missing Bean started as a single café in Oxford and has grown into a family of cafés across Oxfordshire, a bakery, and their own specialty coffee roastery in East Oxford. They build lasting relationships with the farmers who grow their coffee, sourcing ethically and sustainably.

Blacklands Organics, Westmill, Watchfield SN6 8TH [Garden Salad]

Nestled in the rolling countryside of South Oxfordshire, Blacklands Organics is a 10-acre organic vegetable farm founded in 2016 by Jamie and Mary Carr. What started as a dream to grow fresh, wholesome food has blossomed into a thriving farm producing over 100 different varieties of vegetables each year.

Swinbrook Farm, West Oxfordshire [Wild Venison Loin]

Located in West Oxfordshire, this farm offers the highest quality produce using agroecological methods.

Oxford City Farm, Cornwallis Road, Oxford, OX4 3NH [Sorrel & Greens]

A committed team of trustees, volunteers and staff have been working to bring city farming to Oxford since 2008. The community-driven regenerative market garden provides fresh produce while offering educational and therapeutic experiences for the local community.

Tumblebug Ltd, Blenheim Palace Grounds, Blenheim OX20 1UL [Mushrooms]

This pioneering mushroom farm, started in 2024, and set within the Blenheim Palace Estate, is the UK's first fully circular gourmet mushroom farm using a unique substrate made entirely from Blenheim's own organic waste: recycled coffee grounds, compostable packaging, sawdust, and other natural by-products from its cafes and estates.

Traditional Garden Growers, Witney, OX28 [Rhubarb]

Founded by Eddie, Traditional Garden Growers was started from a passion for sustainably growing high-value vegetables and selling directly to local customers. By prioritising soil health, they grow seasonal vegetables using regenerative methods without chemicals. This approach also drives their range of natural soil-boosting products, from Wooutiliser to compost blends and mulches.

Willowbrook Farm, Hampton Gay, Kidlington, OX5 2QQ [Eggs]

Willowbrook Farm was established in 2002 by Dr Lutfi and Ruby Radwan, who left their professional lives to pursue a vision of living in harmony with nature. They transformed a bare piece of Oxfordshire farmland into a thriving 45-acre organic farm that demonstrates how sustainable agriculture, biodiversity, and ethical animal stewardship can work hand in hand.

Middle Farm, Mixbury, Brackley, NN13 5RN [Strawberries]

Middle Farm has been the home of the Rymer's for nearly 100 years and nowadays farms a range of crops across a total of just over 800 acres. The farm is a part of a joint venture consisting of three other local farms to share investment costs. There is a large area put aside for wild bird feed mixes and legume fallows to help preserve the soils.
