



## *Academic-related Grants for Graduates and Undergraduates*

### 1. Freshers' Book Grants

<b>Applicants</b>	All 1 <sup>st</sup> years on their first undergraduate or graduate course – in all subjects.
<b>Purpose</b>	A contribution to cost of course-related books in the first year of their undergraduate or graduate studies.
<b>Quantity</b>	A Blackwell's EGift code worth £ 50 per person, valid until the end of Michaelmas Term. Intended for use on course-related academic books. May be used online or in the shop.
<b>Clarifications</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Available to collect up until Friday of 4<sup>th</sup> week in Michaelmas Term.</li> <li>• Valid until the end of Michaelmas Term.</li> <li>• Not means-tested.</li> </ul>
<b>Application</b>	Available by email request from the Finance Bursar's PA (FBSec@wadham.ox.ac.uk) <b>up until the end of 4<sup>th</sup> week in Michaelmas Term.</b>

### 2. Grants for Students with Declared Disabilities

<b>Applicants</b>	All undergraduate and graduate students registered with the University's Disability Advisory Service.
<b>Purpose</b>	To support academic-related costs which would previously have been covered by the government's Disabled Students Allowance (DSA).
<b>Quantity</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Normally a maximum of £ 200 for equipment, £ 50 per annum for photocopying and consumables.</li> </ul>
<b>Clarifications</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Awards are not automatic but will be assessed by Loans &amp; Grants Committee; application must be supported by a Student Support Plan (a copy of which is normally held by the Academic Administrator).</li> </ul>
<b>Application</b>	<p>While you may apply all year round using the online application form, applications submitted after close of play on <b>Friday of 5<sup>th</sup> week</b> each term will go to the Loans &amp; Grants Committee meeting in the following term.</p> <p>Each application requires a comment from the relevant College Tutor or Advisor. This is requested by the Finance Bursar's PA upon receipt of applications.</p>

### 3. Classics, Ancient History and related joint schools - Holbrook & Bickley Rogers Fund

<b>Purpose</b>	Contribution to course-related activities, including pre-matriculation courses, Summer Schools, exceptional book purchases, trips to conferences.
<b>Quantity</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Discretionary, typically £ 350 for Greek and Latin language courses, up to £600 for those going to courses at British Schools of Athens or Rome.</li> </ul>
<b>Clarifications</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Where courses are residential, the cost of accommodation and travel may be included.</li> <li>For pre-matriculation courses, the grant would normally be paid upon matriculation.</li> <li>Committee will consider advice from the Tutor in Classics or Ancient History when making a decision.</li> </ul>
<b>Application</b>	<p>While you may apply all year round using the online application form, applications submitted after close of play on <b>Friday of 5<sup>th</sup> week</b> each term will go to the Loans &amp; Grants Committee meeting in the following term.</p> <p>Each application requires a comment from the relevant College Tutor or Advisor. This is requested by the Finance Bursar's PA upon receipt of applications.</p>

### 4. Courses with a focus on the Persia and the Middle East - Khusraw Eghbal Fund

<b>Purpose</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Travel Bursaries to assist with overseas course-related study</li> <li>Primarily for Persian Language, literature and history of Iran,</li> <li>Broader applicability to other students of Oriental Studies and European &amp; Middle Eastern Languages (EMEL) studying the ancient and/or modern languages of the Middle East.</li> </ul>
<b>Quantity</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Discretionary, typically £ 350 - 400.</li> </ul>
<b>Clarifications</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Committee will consider advice from the Fellow in Persian or the Professorial Fellow in Iranian Studies when making a decision.</li> </ul>
<b>Application</b>	<p>While you may apply all year round using the online application form, applications submitted after close of play on <b>Friday of 5<sup>th</sup> week</b> each term will go to the Loans &amp; Grants Committee meeting in the following term.</p> <p>Each application requires a comment from the relevant College Tutor or Advisor. This is requested by the Finance Bursar's PA upon receipt of applications.</p>

## 5. Middle Eastern, Islamic and South Asian studies - Thomas Family Fund

<b>Purpose</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Contribution towards a project in one of the subject areas above (including but not restricted to the study of religion, history, literature and art).</li> <li>May include a contribution to travel costs.</li> </ul>
<b>Quantity</b>	Discretionary, typically up to £ 325.
<b>Clarifications</b>	Committee will consider advice from Tutors in Oriental Studies when making a decision.
<b>Application</b>	<p>While you may apply all year round using the online application form, applications submitted after close of play on <b>Friday of 5<sup>th</sup> week</b> each term will go to the Loans &amp; Grants Committee meeting in the following term.</p> <p>Each application requires a comment from the relevant College Tutor or Advisor. This is requested by the Finance Bursar's PA upon receipt of applications.</p> <p>Award holders are expected to write a letter of thanks to the Thomas Family, outlining how the grant has made a difference to them.</p>

## 6. Clinical Medicine - Medical Equipment Grants

<b>Applicants</b>	All on-course Clinical Medicine students
<b>Purpose</b>	Contribute to cost of small items of necessary medical equipment (e.g. stethoscopes) and books.
<b>Quantity</b>	Typically up to £ 100.
<b>Clarifications</b>	Committee will consider recommendation of Tutors in Medicine or College Advisor when making a decision.
<b>Applications</b>	<p>While you may apply all year round using the online application form, applications submitted after close of play on <b>Friday of 5<sup>th</sup> week</b> each term will go to the Loans &amp; Grants Committee meeting in the following term.</p> <p>Each application requires a comment from the relevant College Tutor or Advisor. This is requested by the Finance Bursar's PA upon receipt of applications.</p>

## 7. Local history research - Wyndham Fund

<b>Purpose</b>	Small discretionary awards to assist students in research in local history.
<b>Quantity</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Discretionary, typically £ 100 - £ 200.</li> </ul>
<b>Clarifications</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>"Local History" is taken to mean history focused on a particular area or neighbourhood (but not necessarily local to Oxford).</li> </ul>
<b>Application</b>	<p>While you may apply all year round using the online application form, applications submitted after close of play on <b>Friday of 5<sup>th</sup> week</b> each term will go to the Loans &amp; Grants Committee meeting in the following term.</p> <p>Each application requires a comment from the relevant College Tutor or Advisor. This is requested by the Finance Bursar's PA upon receipt of applications.</p>

## 8. Thesis printing and Binding Grant

<b>Applicants</b>	Graduates and undergraduates – all subjects
<b>Purpose</b>	Thesis printing and binding – upon submission of Thesis (or Dissertation).
<b>Quantity</b>	Max of £ 95 (per degree course). Up to 100% of costs.
<b>Application</b>	<p>While you may apply all year round using the online application form, applications submitted after close of play on <b>Friday of 5<sup>th</sup> week</b> each term will go to the Loans &amp; Grants Committee meeting in the following term.</p> <p>Each application requires a comment from the relevant College Tutor or Advisor. This is requested by the Finance Bursar's PA upon receipt of applications.</p>
